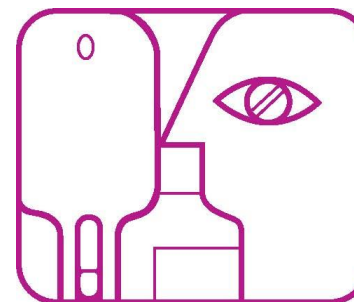

The **2009 UKCPA Napp Pain Award** is sponsored by Napp Pharmaceuticals Limited and is designed to recognise innovation and excellence in the delivery of pain management and to improve patient care in one of the following areas:

- Development of guidelines for the treatment pain
- Education &/or counselling of patient(s) and their carer(s) about pain
- Use of analgesics in the management of acute pain, cancer or persistent non-cancer pain
- The role of a pharmacist in the multidisciplinary team
- Issues around the primary care / secondary care interface in pain management
- Use of non-medical prescribing in pain management

Submissions may relate to any area of clinical practice which results in improvement to patients' pain management.

Applications are invited from UKCPA members who have completed work in any of the above areas.

The award of £1500 will enable the winner to present the work (by supporting full expenses)

- **as a short lecture at the UKCPA Pain Management Group Study Day, 5th October 2009, Jury's Inn Nottingham; and**
- **as a poster presentation at the UKCPA Autumn Residential Symposium, 13 – 15 November 2009, Holiday Inn, Stratford upon Avon**

The successful applicant will receive the **2009 Napp Pain Award** at the Autumn Symposium in Stratford upon Avon.

Winning of the award does not necessarily guarantee publication in a journal.

Neither UKCPA or Napp Pharmaceuticals Limited accept responsibility in respect of the referees decision, which is final.

Outline of submission

The submission should not exceed 1000 words (with maximum of 2 tables or 2 figures) and should include the following:

1. Title
2. Background
3. Aim and Objectives
4. Methods

5. Results
6. Discussion and conclusion
7. References

Instructions for preparation of papers

- A4, typed single spaced, Arial 11pt (titles 12pt)
- Margins 2.5cm, justified text left and right
- Paragraphs, double spaced between with no indentation
- References: use Vancouver system as in Pharmaceutical Journal

Please include the following in a covering letter stating:

1. Category of work – whether the work is research, audit or practice/professional development.
2. If not successful for this award, whether you wish your paper to be considered for the UKCPA Autumn Symposium 2009 as a poster/oral presentation. If so, the submission must meet criteria as per UKCPA Guidance for Short papers/Call for papers (available on UKCPA website: www.ukcpa.org)
3. Confirmation that the paper complies with the requirements for submission
4. Applicants should confirm that their proposals have not been submitted for any other award, state whether or not the work has already been published, and if so, give details of where. Work which has previously been published will still be considered for the award, but may not be published as an abstract in Clinical Pharmacist.

Submission requirements

- ONE full electronic copy of the submission with all authors and organisations(s) cited
- ONE anonymous electronic copy of the submission without author(s) and organisation(s) details for adjudication purposes – **please ensure that your paper is totally anonymous throughout to avoid disqualification.** This includes removing the name of the relevant Trust throughout the main body of the paper
- Entries should be submitted either on CD enclosed with your covering letter or emailed direct to the UKCPA office (admin@ukcpa.com)
